

Obverse Die O2X-L4 – Obverse C3a



- This large cent was detected on-line, in January 2023. The images of various attributes are obscured.
- Appears to not have a chip near the 'N' in REGINA, but if it is later deemed that a chip is present, when other examples are seen in hand, a re-designation to O2W-L6 would be warranted.
- Besides die O2Y-S2, this is the only other known obverse C3a die to have a 'T' re-punched (in this case the T in VICTORIA) with the elongated serif 'T' of the PEI cent. This is therefore a CERT die identifying feature.

- This coin was detected on-line and therefore the images of various attributes is obscured. It is the only one seen so far by this author.
- The single die crack through L15 is unique and not known on any other reverse dies. Dies R10-L34 and R10-L36 have no known die cracks however their dates do not seem to match this die.
